For Jews Earth Day is (at Least) 1800 years Old

Tu B'Shevat falls on Thursday, February 13 this year. We will commemorate this festival at Shabbat Eve services the following evening.

In the United States we began celebrating something called "Earth Day" 55 years ago in 1970. Earth Day responded to a need to recognize and take cognizance of our human responsibility to protect our environment.

Tu B'Shevat is known as, "the birthday of the trees." Trees are vital to the arability of the land of Israel. **It is first and foremost a holiday to remind us of our responsibility to care for the environment.**

Our festival of environmental awareness, Tu B'Shevat, is first mentioned in the Mishnah, which was compiled between 200 BCE and 200 CE. That means we Jews have been observing our "Earth Day" and focusing on environmental awareness for at least 1800 years.

A wonderful Midrash depicts G-d addressing Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden saying: "Behold my beautiful earth! You are now responsible for caring for and preserving it. But beware and know that if you destroy and pollute it, there will never be another one." (*Kohelet Rabbah 7:13*)

It gives me pride as a Jew to realize that our people institutionalized the sense of responsibility for our environment at least 1800 years before the modern world concretized that concern into a day of national observance.

In our community, our congregant Dr. Megan Davis Hodgkins celebrates Earth Day every day. She is the world's foremost expert on the Queen Conch. She is the Research Professor at the Aquaculture Laboratory, Harbor Branch Oceanographic Institute, of Florida Atlantic University.

For over 40 years, she has studied the Queen Conch cultivated them and reintroduced these beautiful creatures into the sea waters of Florida and the Caribbean. The Conchs greatly reduce ocean pollution, and we are proud at Temple Beth Shalom to have a congregant who works so diligently to restore our earth. Recently, Megan gave Vickie and me a guided tour of her laboratory and the work that she does. We were both deeply moved by the experience.

In the late 1980's, when I served as Rabbi in Nashville, the then Senator from Tennessee Albert Gore began doing research and convening seminars which led to his books and movie about the environment which eventually won him the Nobel Prize for Peace. At the first of these occasions held in Nashville, Senator Gore asked me to deliver a closing homily that concretized this concern.

On that occasion I shared the following story which I recounted to you on Rosh Hashanah:
Once upon a time -- long ago -- there was a goat with horns so long that when he stretched his neck, they grazed the sky and caused the stars to sing the most beautiful melody anyone had ever heard. One day a man was walking through the forest thinking of buying a gift for his wife's birthday when he encountered the goat. Seeing his beautiful horns he thought to cut a small piece off of one to make a jewelry box for his wife. He asked the goat if he could do so, and the goat being a friendly sort agreed. When friends saw the lovely jewelry box, everyone wanted one. Then many people each took just a little bit of the goat's precious horn for his or her own use. As a result, the stars no longer sing.
For me this story conveys the essential message of Tu B'Shevat: So, thank you, "Earth Day" and thank you Dr. Davis Hodgkins for reinforcing the ancient lesson of Tu B'Shevat. We are in charge of and responsible for this earth. If we destroy it, we shall never have another one.

Four Chaplains Commemoration



Rabbi Fuchs has accepted the honor of delivering the keynote address at the annual Four Chaplains Commemoration Ceremony in Sebastian on Monday, February 3 at 11 AM.

The ceremony place is at the Veteran's Memorial corner of Indian River Drive and Harrison Street in Sebastian.

In 2006, the Mayor of West Hartford, CT presented Rabbi Fuchs with the Four Chaplains Award in recognition of his extensive interfaith efforts and work in the community.

The four chaplains, are Rabbi (Dr.) Alexander D. Goode, Rev. George L. Fox, Rev. Clark V. Poling, and Father John P. Washington.

They served on the Troop Ship Dorchester that was bombed in the North Atlantic on February 3, 1943. When the ship's supply of life jackets ran out, the chaplains each gave theirs to another sailor. They stood arm in arm on the deck saying prayers and singing hymns as the ship sank into the ocean.

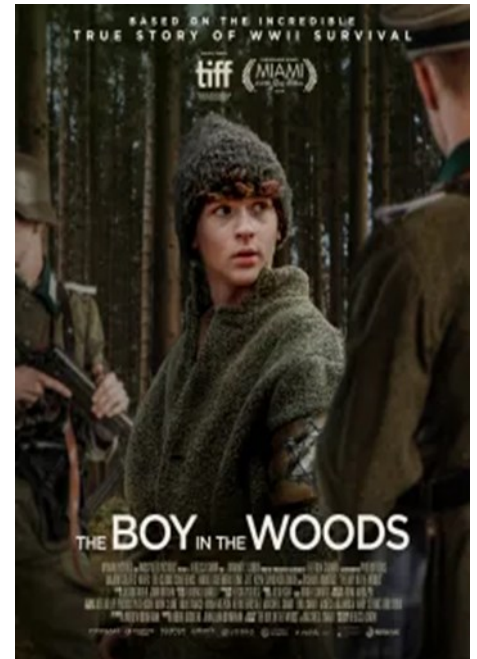


