Cantor's Corner



The December Dilemma: Hanukkah and Christmas

Each December, millions of families across the United States anticipate a season filled with lights, gifts, and gatherings. For some, it's the twinkling Christmas tree and carols; for others, it's the glow of the menorah and the spinning of dreidels. Families that celebrate both Hanukkah and Christmas, or that come from interfaith backgrounds, often encounter what is known as the "December Dilemma." This dilemma refers to the challenges and opportunities that arise when two beloved holidays, rooted in different religious traditions, occur around the same time.

The December Dilemma is an experience shared by many Jewish and Christian families, particularly those who are interfaith or multicultural. The close timing of Hanukkah and Christmas can raise questions about how to honor both traditions respectfully, how to navigate family expectations, and how to foster a sense of belonging and identity for children. Hanukkah is an eight-day Jewish holiday that commemorates the rededication of the Second Temple in Jerusalem. We celebrate by retelling the story of the miracle of the small amount of oil lasting eight days by lighting the menorah, we play dreidel, eat fried foods such as latkes and sufganiyot (jelly donuts), and exchange small gifts. Hanukkah is a joyous but relatively minor holiday in the Jewish calendar, elevated in prominence in some communities due to its proximity to Christmas.

Christmas, celebrated on December 25th, marks the birth of Jesus Christ in Christian tradition. It is a major religious and cultural holiday, celebrated with church services, the decoration of Christmas trees, exchanging of gifts, and festive meals. Its traditions have grown to encompass both religious and secular aspects, making it a widely observed holiday even among those who do not identify as Christian.

It can be challenging balancing interfaith traditions. Deciding how to incorporate both sets of rituals especially when extended families have strong preferences. Children can feel pulled between two traditions or struggle to define their own religious identity. The Gift-Giving expectations with both holidays can cause worries for families about excessiveness or equitably honoring each tradition. Some families may feel excluded from community events that focus solely on one holiday.

Rather than viewing the December Dilemma solely as a challenge, many families find ways to embrace the richness of both traditions. Some families choose to celebrate both Hanukkah and Christmas, emphasizing the unique aspects of each. Taking the time to learn about and explain the meaning behind each holiday can foster understanding and respect. Many interfaith families blend customs or develop their own rituals that reflect their unique backgrounds.

Most importantly to navigate this special time of year having open communication, expectations and values with children and relatives helps avoid misunderstandings and creates a more inclusive environment. The December Dilemma is not just a challenge—it's an opportunity to build bridges, deepen understanding, and create new memories that honor a family's diverse heritage. By approaching the season with openness, respect, and creativity, families can turn the December Dilemma into a time of joy, connection, and lasting tradition.

I wish everyone a joy filled Holiday Season!

Those little lights remind us how powerful hope and faith can be, and how much brighter our world becomes when we share our light with each other!


Ladies, 2026 is around the corner.

Did You Know You May Be Able to Pay Synagogue Dues on a Tax-Advantaged Basis?

If you are 70 1/2 or older, and have a traditional (deductible) IRA, you can make a direct transfer from your IRA to TBS, for dues and contributions, and save the taxes on the entire amount of the transfer.

This special direct transfer is called a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD). By making this small change in the way you take your distributions, you can benefit yourself and the Synagogue, at the same time. There's an annual dollar limit on QCDs, so talk to your accountant or financial adviser for additional details.

Please remember when doing this to be sure that your financial institution includes your name on the check so we know whose account to appropriate it to.






